In fact, Family Practice residents who are required to rotate through Ophthalmology voted for Dr. Aaron to receive their Teacher of the Year award. This is a very unusual situation, and Dr. Aaron certainly deserved the honor. Within Ophthalmology, she received the Resident

Education Appreciation Award given by the graduating residents to the faculty member who, over the term of their training, was their best educator and most sincere mentor."
